



Global Rescue Recommended by Fly Fisherman Magazine

On a trip to the Amazon with Lefty Kreh a few years ago, one angler died, one had a stroke, and another angler with a medical emergency had to be evacuated from Manaus to the U.S. Lefty advises: "No one should travel outside the U.S. without travel insurance, particularly without medical evacuation insurance, yet many relatively wealthy fishermen who travel to remote locations fail to buy it." Most U.S. health insurance policies do not pay for transportation back to the U.S.

Don Causey, publisher of the Angling Report (www.anglingreport.com), says medical transportation insurance is a must. On a trip to Cameroon in

May 2006, Causey fell 35 feet from a shooting blind and suffered serious back injuries. He had no insurance. The emergency medical flight from Cameroon to the U.S. cost him \$124,000. Based on his experience, Causey recommends Global Rescue (www.globalrescue.com) for the best trip insurance.

Anglers should also be sure to bring their passports when traveling to Canada or Mexico. Driver's licenses were previously accepted for re-entry from those neighboring countries but U.S. citizens are now required to show a passport when going or returning from abroad.
